The HELP Program supports students and families in the Lincoln County School District who are experiencing homelessness or housing instability, including those living in temporary or inadequate housing or without a parent or guardian. The program serves students who qualify under the McKinney-Vento Act as well as students involved with the foster care system.

A student may be eligible for McKinney-Vento services if they lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence. This can include staying with others due to hardship, living in a hotel or shelter, residing in a car or RV, or staying in a place without basic safety or utilities. Unaccompanied youth without a parent or guardian may also qualify. Students in foster care qualify if they are in DHS custody. Resource parents caring for foster students are encouraged to contact the HELP Program Coordinator for assistance.
